


School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).



This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Carter G. Woodson Charter School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Carter G. Woodson Charter School is \$5,416,048.00, of which \$4,583,216.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$325,403.00 is other state funds, \$7,500.00 is local funds, and \$499,929.00 is federal funds. Of the \$499,929.00 in federal funds, \$151,091.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$4,583,216.00 in LCFF Funds, \$1,226,852.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to desribe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Carter G. Woodson Charter School plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

Carter G. Woodson Charter School plans to spend \$4,782,981.00 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$1,435,330.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$3,347,651.00 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:


The slight increase of \$2,105 more in supplemental and concentration dollars projected for 2020-21 is because the ratio of enrollment to unduplicated pupil count (UPC) changed from the adopted budget to CBEDS. The total LCFF revenue is about the same since Carter Woodson is a nonclassroom based charter school and is being funded on 2019-20 P-2 ADA. This additional revenue will be spent on additional chromebooks for our UPC students.

Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity
Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

In 2020-2021, Carter G. Woodson Charter School is projecting it will receive \$1,226,852.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Carter G. Woodson Charter School must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the Learning Continuity Plan. Carter G. Woodson Charter School plans to spend \$1,120,004.00 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the Learning Continuity Plan. The additional improved services described in the plan include the following:

At Carter G. Wooodson, almost 100% of students are unduplicated pupil count (UPC) students. Our school continues to provide services in accordance with the following 3 components: 1) Content delivery 2) Access to mobile Devices 3) Access to internet; for instance, we have expanded our online capabilities including purchasing platforms such as Zoom, Microsoft teams, and Google Classsroom.

Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-2020



This chart compares what Carter G. Woodson Charter School budgeted in the 2019-20 LCAP for actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students with what Carter G. Woodson Charter School actually spent on actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students in the 2019-20 school year.

In 2019-2020, Carter G. Woodson Charter School's LCAP budgeted \$1,219,746.00 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. Carter G. Woodson Charter School actually spent \$1,223,763.00 for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students in 2019-2020.
